Charlene, Senior Vice President of the Jewish Community Foundation and Executive Director and Vice President of the Leichtag Foundation, accepted the award at the Jewish Funders Network International Conference in Los Angeles on Sunday, March 17. Charlene is the eighth recipient of the J.J. Greenberg Memorial Award and serves on the board of the Jewish Funders Network.

She also oversees grant making and donor engagement programs.
