### The Eighth Annual Nonprofit Governance Symposium

Recently, the Jewish Community Foundation participated in the University of San Diego's Eighth Annual Nonprofit Governance Symposium held at the Joan B. Kroc Institute for Peace. More than 150 leaders in the nonprofit sector came together to share new thinking and best practices with the goal of strengthening community organizations countywide.

Foundation President and CEO, Marjory Kaplan, and Vice President of Endowments and Communications, Gail Littman, were featured speakers at the well-attended event.

Paul Van Dolah, principal of Van Dolah & Associates, titled, "Making in Meaningful: Board Engagement Strategies" was a lively discussion focused on the critical fiduciary role of the board and the importance of keeping board members engaged in the mission of the organization. Both shared their vast experience working with national and local nonprofit boards.

The annual Symposium brought together board members and professionals from a wide cross-section of the nonprofit sector in San Diego County. Representatives from San Diego Hospice, the San Diego Symphony, YMCA, Surfriider Foundation and Jewish Family Service were among the dozens of organizations that attended the two-day seminar.
