Over the years, Claudia has been an active volunteer in the community, having served on the boards of Hillel of San Diego and the Jewish Federation of San Diego.

Claudia earned her bachelor's degree in Social Sciences from UC Berkeley and her master's degree in management from the Kelley School of Business at Indiana University, Bloomington, where she did collaborative work with the Center on Philanthropy in Indianapolis.
