Six-Year Old San Diego Girl Youngest Lion of Judah Endowment in Country

Shana Kari Weisman has established a Lion of Judah Endowment (LOJE) with the Jewish Community Foundation, making her the youngest such donor in the country. A LOJE provides an annual gift of \$5,000 or more to the Annual Campaign of the United Jewish Federation of San Diego County in perpetuity.

Shana's LOJE continues a legacy for the Chorteks and for the community. Both Shana's grandmother, Elaine Chortek and her mother, Susan Chortek Weisman, have established such gifts.

Establishing a Mother-Daughter Endowment was so meaningful and important to me that I wanted Shana to share in that feeling. We want giving back to the Jewish Community to be a high priority for both our children," said Susan Chortek Weisman.

San Diego is considered one of the leading communities throughout the country in this area. Thirty-four women have established Lion of Judah Endowments to date.

"Jewish women in our community are passionately committed to the values of Judaism and the passing of these ethics and traditions from one generation to the next," stated Miriam Robbins, Women's Division Director at the United Jewish Federation of San Diego County.
